

ZORYVE cream 0.15% is a prescription medicine used on the skin (topical) to treat mild to moderate eczema (atopic dermatitis) in adults and children 6 years of age and older.

It is not known if ZORYVE cream 0.15% is safe and effective in children with mild to moderate eczema (atopic dermatitis) under 6 years of age.

ZORYVE cream 0.05% is a prescription medicine used on the skin (topical) to treat mild to moderate eczema (atopic dermatitis) in children 2 to 5 years of age.

It is not known if ZORYVE cream 0.05% is safe and effective in children with mild to moderate eczema (atopic dermatitis) under 2 years of age and 6 years of age and older.

ZORYVE is for use on the skin (topical only). Do not use ZORYVE in or on your eyes, mouth, or vagina. **Do not use ZORYVE** if you have certain liver problems.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION, continued

Before using ZORYVE, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- · have liver problems.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if ZORYVE will harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if ZORYVE passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby during treatment with ZORYVE. Breastfeeding women using ZORYVE should use it on the smallest area of the skin and for the shortest time needed. Do not apply ZORYVE directly to the nipple or areola to avoid contact with your baby.

Tell your healthcare provider about the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

The most common side effects of ZORYVE cream 0.15% in adults and children 6 years of age and older treated for atopic dermatitis include:

- headache
- diarrhea
- nausea
- vomiting
- application site pain

The most common side effects of ZORYVE cream 0.05% in children 2 to 5 years of age treated for atopic dermatitis include:

- upper respiratory tract infections
- stuffy or runny nose
- tract infection:diarrhea
- red or swollen eyes (like "pink eye")
- vomiting
- headache
